Subj: CALENDAR YEAR 2016 MARINE CORPS BASE CAMP LEJEUNE INTRAMURAL RIFLE AND PISTOL COMPETITION

1. Purpose. This Bulletin announces the annual Camp Lejeune Intramural Rifle and Pistol Competition for Calendar Year (CY) 2016. References (a) and (b) establish both the Marine Corps and Marine Corps Installations East-Marine Corps Base, Camp Lejeune (MCIEAST-MCB CAMLEJ) policy in regards to annual qualification and competition.

2. Background. From 29 February 2016 to 11 March 2016, MCIEAST-MCB CAMLEJ will host the annual Camp Lejeune Intramural Rifle and Pistol Competition at Weapons Training Battalion (WTBN), Stone Bay in order to increase the marksmanship proficiency of the units that participate and stimulate interest in the Marine Corps Competition in Arms Program.

3. Action

a. Commander's Intent and Concept of Operations

(1) Commander's Intent. To promote greater rifle and pistol marksmanship proficiency, increased interaction and camaraderie amongst the Camp Lejeune area units and tenant units, and reaffirmation of our legacy of "Every Marine a Rifleman".

(2) Concept of Operations

(a) Two team captain meetings will be conducted to confirm the number of competitors and coordinate all necessary support prior to the competition.

(b) The competition will consist of two weeks of shooting. Week one will consist of practice on the Division Match course of fire. Week two of the competition will consist of an individual and team competition using the Division Match course of fire.

b. Tasks

(1) MCIEAST-MCB CAMLEJ Commands. Ensure Team Captains attend the meeting in Building RR-11 at 1300 on 3 February 2016 and 1300 on 17 February 2016.

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(2) Tenant Commands. All tenant commands are invited to participate in the program. All Team Captains from II Marine Expeditionary Force (MEF), 2d Marine Division (MarDiv), 2d Marine Logistics Group (MLG), 2d Marine Aircraft Wing (MAW), U.S. Marine Corps Forces, Special Operations Command (MARSOC), Training and Education Command (TECOM) Schools, Marine Corps Air Station New River (MCAS NR), and MCAS Cherry Point are required to attend the meetings in Building RR-11 at 1300 on 3 February 2016 and 1300 on 17 February 2016.

(3) Commanding Officer, WTBN

(a) Provide billeting to all competitors as needed and coordinate messing requirements with the MCIEAST-MCB CAMLEJ G-4, Food Service Officer.

(b) Provide additional support as necessary to conduct the competition.

(c) Reserve the Stone Bay Gym, RR-8 on 29 February 2016 for welcome aboard brief and classes, and for 10 and 11 March 2016 for rehearsals and awards ceremony.

(d) Provide Match Executive Officer (XO) and personnel to conduct Base Intramural Matches.

(4) Assistant Chief of Staff (AC/S), G-3/5. Provide Combat Camera support to develop and print Intramural Welcome Aboard Pamphlet and Awards Program. Provide audio visual support as requested by Match XO.

(5) AC/S, G-4

(a) Temp Loan 350 chairs and 20 tables to designated WTBN Responsible Officer for use during the Intramural Matches no later than 08 March 2016.

(b) Provide messing to all competitors as coordinated with WTBN.

(6) Public Affairs Officer. Coordinate and facilitate internal and external media promotion and residual coverage using communications assets to include the Globe, Camp Lejeune's website and social media, press releases, and LCTV-10.

c. Coordinating Instructions

(1) The CY 2016 competition will be conducted at WTBN from 29 February 2016 to 11 March 2016.

(2) On 3 February 2016, a meeting for all Team Captains from respective units will be conducted in Building RR-11 at 1300. This meeting will cover administrative requirements, check-in procedures, billeting, course of fire, and messing.

(3) On 17 February 2016, Team Captains will have a second meeting in Building RR-11 at 1300. Team Captains will turn in all rosters and meal requests to the Match XO, and confirm billeting arrangements with WTBN Billeting in Building RR-4.

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(4) On 26 February 2016, the in-brief for all Competitors, Coaches, and Team Captains will go at 0730 at the Stone Bay Gym. All personnel must attend this brief in order to participate in the competition. Units will check-in to WTBN for the competition. All paperwork will be turned in to Match XO, RR-51, and all weapons will be turned in to WTBN Armory, RR-44. All competitors must be present for the check-in and weapons turn in.

(5) All units assigned to MCB CAMLEJ, II MEF, 2d MarDiv, 2d MLG, MARSOC, TECOM Schools, and all MCAS NR and Cherry Point units are eligible to enter into this competition. Commanding Officers (COs) and Officers-In-Charge (OICs) of units eligible to participate are requested to enter competitors, per the following criteria:

(a) All units are encouraged to send as many individuals to the competition as possible. The Match XO will limit the number of competitors per unit if the total match number exceeds 276.

(b) Personnel on Temporary Additional Duty or assigned by the Fleet Assistance Program are authorized to compete with units to which they are attached.

(c) Personnel that are Distinguished Marksmen and those personnel with points toward becoming a Distinguished Marksman are encouraged to coach their unit team; however, they are not eligible for individual awards and may only serve as the coach in the team matches.

(6) Teams will be organized as follows for the team competition of the Division Match course of fire:

(a) Each team must have a minimum of four shooting members.

(b) Two firing members must be enlisted Marines, one of which must be a sergeant or below. At least one competitor must be a "Tyro" (an enlisted Marine who has not previously competed in an Intramural or a Division Match).

(c) The third competitor must be a staff noncommissioned officer.

(d) The fourth competitor must be an officer.

(e) A Team Captain and Coach (they may be the same individual and may be a firing member).

(f) A minimum of two target pullers per team for Team Competition Day.

(g) Units may field multiple teams and not all individual competitors from a unit are required to fire on the team match day.

(7) The M16A4/M-4 Service Rifle (with Rifle Combat Optic) with a leather or web sling and M9 Service Pistol will be utilized for the competition.

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4. Administration and Logistics

a. Administration. Trophies and certificates will be presented for the following:

(1) Individual Rifle Competition winners for each stage of fire (1st through 3rd place): 200 yard slow fire, 200 yard rapid fire, 300 yard rapid fire, and the 500 yard slow fire will receive a certificate.

(2) Individual Pistol Competition winners for each stage of fire (1st through 3rd place): 25 yard slow fire, 25 yard timed fire, and 25 yard rapid fire will receive a certificate.

(3) Individual Rifle Competition Winners: 1st place, 2nd place, and 3rd place receive a trophy.

(4) Individual Pistol Competition Winners: 1st place, 2nd place, and 3rd place receive a trophy.

(5) Individual Rifle and Pistol winners: 1st place receive trophies and 2nd and 3rd place receive certificates.

(6) Rifle Team Competition.

(7) Pistol Team Competition.

(8) CGs Cup: Rifle/pistol team combined aggregate winner.

c. Logistics

(1) Messing will be available at the Stone Bay Mess Hall (RR 135).

(2) Team Captains will turn in all rosters and meal requests to the Match XO (910-440-2705), and make billeting arrangements with WTBN Billeting (910-440-2651) in Building RR-4 no later than 17 February 2016.


(3) All necessary shooting equipment will be specified in the welcome aboard package published by WTBN at a later date and briefed to the Team Captains at the initial meeting. All necessary shooting equipment will be the responsibility of the individual competitor and/or his parent unit. WTBN has a limited number of competition shooting equipment such as shooting jackets, gloves, spotting scopes, and stands which will be available for issue at WTBN supply on a first come first served basis.

(4) The M16A4/M-4 Service Rifle (with Rifle Combat Optic) with a leather or web sling and M9 Service Pistol will be utilized for the competition. Shooting jackets, shooting/coaching chairs with spotting scopes and pistol boxes are authorized.

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(5) Limited Technical Inspections for all weapons must be completed and documentation submitted when weapons are turned into the WTBN Armory on 20 February 2016.

5. Reserve Applicability. This Bulletin is applicable to all units assigned to MCIEAST-MCB CAMLEJ, II MEF, 2d MarDiv, 2d MLG, MARSOC, TECOM Schools, MCAS NR, MCAS Cherry Point units, and Marine Corps Reserve units.
