1. Purpose. References (a) and (b) indicate a trend among Marines and Sailors to ingest substances to induce intoxication, excitement, or stupefaction of the central nervous system. Such substances include, but are not limited to, the substances listed in enclosure (1). The abuse of these substances and others like them poses a significant threat to the health and safety of Marines and Sailors, as well as the efficiency, discipline, and good order of Marine units.

2. Background. The dangers these substances pose is evidenced by the Drug Enforcement Agency classifying five synthetic cannabinoids as Schedule I controlled substances (reference (c)); additionally, 21 states have passed laws or departmental bans against these substances (including Georgia, reference (d); Virginia, reference (e); North Carolina, reference (f)) and laws


are pending in eight other states (including South Carolina, reference (g)). Although legally sold under current laws in some states, reference (h) prohibits the possession, purchase, use, sale, distribution, introduction onto a military installation, and manufacture of the items listed in enclosure (1). Furthermore, reference (i) prohibits the unlawful use of controlled substance analogues (designer drugs), natural substances (e.g., fungi, excretions), chemicals (e.g., chemicals wrongfully used as inhalants), propellants, and/or a prescribed or over-the-counter drug or pharmaceutical compound, with the intent to induce intoxication, excitement, or stupefaction of the central nervous system.

### 3. Action

a. In accordance with the emergency procedures of Appendix B-6(n) of reference (j), Installation Commanders are directed to declare establishments in their local area offering the substances in enclosure (1) temporarily off-limits to all military personnel in order to ensure good order, discipline, and safety aboard their installations. Following the invocation of this emergency power, all Commanders will forward their decisions for action by the Armed Forces Disciplinary Control Board at the first available opportunity in accordance with references (j), section 2-6 and (k).

b. Previous action(s) concerning establishments selling the substances in enclosure (1), e.g. placing them off-limits, should be reviewed as required by reference (j). As new establishments are found, appropriate actions should be taken in accordance with Appendix B-6(n) of reference (j).

4. Reserve Applicability. This Bulletin is applicable to all personnel assigned to MCIEAST.
