Subj: PRISONER ESCAPE PLAN

Ref: (a) SECNAVINST 1640.9C
(b) MCO 5500.6F
(c) MCO P5800.16A, w/Ch 1-5

1. Situation. This Order provides policy for the scope and intensity of operations taken to recapture an escaped prisoner. The intensity will be determined by the circumstances surrounding the escapee's confinement, his confinement security classification and the escapee's potential danger to society. As a general rule, action taken incident to efforts to apprehend the escapee falls under one of two categories:

a. Those which can be routinely accomplished by on-duty Base Brig and Military Police (MP) personnel, and

b. Those which require additional personnel and/or extraordinary measures as necessary.

2. Cancellation. BO 1640.2E.

3. Mission

a. To update the procedures and action to be taken upon activation of the Brig Escape Plan by the Brig Commanding Officer (CO).

b. Summary of Revision. This Order has been revised and should be reviewed in its entirety.

4. Execution

a. Commander's Intent and Concept of Operations

(1) Commander's Intent

(a) The Director, Installation Security and Safety (ISS), will assume cognizance; the Base Provost Marshal, in conjunction with Naval Criminal Investigative Service (NCIS),

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will direct all operations incident to efforts to apprehend escapee.

(b) This Order outlines immediate actions to be taken by the Brig and MP Divisions of ISS (to include the Duty Brig Supervisor and the MP Platoon Leader, respectively), and the escapee's command subsequent to the activation of the Brig Escape Plan by the Brig CO. Extraordinary operations may include closing specific exits and/or escape routes from the Base; checking all outbound vehicles, and systematic isolation and searching select buildings and areas of the Base.

(2) Concept of Operations

(a) Brig Division. Duty Brig Supervisor, Base Brig, will:

1. Immediately notify the PMO Desk Sergeant and provide the following:

a. All available information applicable to the escaped prisoner(s), i.e., physical description, clothing, time and location of escape, circumstances, etc., sufficient for the publication of a Military Police Alert (MPA).

b. Applicable confinement information as expeditiously as possible to include:

(1) Confinement classification of escapee.

(2) Type of courts-martial under which escapee was tried and the charges convicted of; or, if escapee is undergoing pretrial confinement, the alleged charges for which confined.

(3) Any known information concerning the escapee's mental or physical condition for which the escapee could be considered dangerous.

2. Recall all Brig personnel.

3. Notify the escapee's command.

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(b) Commanding Officer, Base Brig, will:

1. Direct all internal Brig operations and coordinated efforts with the MP Division to ensure full scope of confinement information is provided.

2. Notify the Director, ISS.

3. Notify NCIS and coordinate assistance.

4. Notify the Base Command Duty Officer (CDO).

5. Based upon confinement data and classifications criteria per reference (a), the Brig CO or his designated representative will make a recommendation to the Provost Marshal, via the Director, ISS, as to whether routine or extraordinary measures should be initiated to recapture the escapee.

6. As soon as possible, but not before notifying the Director, ISS, notify the Commandant of the Marine Corps (MHC) by telephone, followed by a naval message per reference (a).

7. Publish and distribute DD Form 553 per reference (c).

8. Review prisoner history for possible action related to victim/witness notification.

(c) Military Police Division. PMO Desk Sergeant will:

1. Obtain a physical description of the escapee and all other immediately available details and information on the escape and escapee from the source who reports the escape.

2. Notify the Duty MP Platoon Leader to relay all available information and receive further instructions.

3. Immediately prepare and release MPA to all gates, stations, and patrols over the Base Security Net.

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4. Immediately notify, via Police Information Network (PIN), city, county and local state law enforcement agencies that a military prisoner has escaped. Include in the MPA the following, which will be obtained from the Base Brig staff.

a. Area where escape occurred.

b. Presumed dress of prisoner uniform (i.e., international orange prisoner uniform, blue detainee uniform, PT gear, olive drab field jacket during winter months, etc.).

c. Verification that escapee does not have in his possession: money, wallet, military identification card, or those articles normally carried on one's person.

d. Local friend's residence, if applicable.

e. Immediate family's home of record to provide potential direction of travel.

f. Mail and visitation list information if available.

(d) Duty Military Police Platoon Leader will:

1. Upon notification by the PMO Desk Sergeant of an escape, immediately direct and coordinate the efforts of on-duty MP patrols and gate sentries to affect the apprehension of the escapee using standard Military Police Operations.

2. Notify the Provost Marshal to relay available information and receive further instructions.

3. Evaluate all information concerning the escape and escapee, paying particular attention to the information outlined in paragraph 4a(2)(a)1 above.

4. Immediately initiate the measures listed in paragraph 4a(2)(e) below if based on initial information received, there is a clear and evident necessity for the implementation of extraordinary measures to effect the capture of an escapee (i.e. escape of a 'maximum custody' prisoner or the escape of a prisoner for which competent authority has

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specifically authorized the use of deadly force to prevent his escape).

5. Notify the Base CDO of any extraordinary operations, either initiated under the provisions of paragraph 4a(2)(d)4 above or directed by the Provost Marshal, which would disrupt the normal operations of Marine Corps Base (e.g., closing areas, gates, etc.).

6. If recall of off-duty Military Police has been directed, alert the Headquarters and Support Battalion Mess Hall Manager as to unusual mess requirements.

(e) Provost Marshal. The Provost Marshal will evaluate all available information about the escape and determine if the implementation of extraordinary measures (or the continuation of these measures if the Duty Platoon Leader has already initiated extraordinary measures) is warranted to affect the recapture of the escapee(s). Should such measures be initiated, he/she will direct such operation as considered necessary and feasible to include, but not limited to:

1. Recall, stage and brief all appropriate off-duty MP's and Brig personnel.

2. Request augmentation or assistance from Base units or activities, the 2d Marine Division MP Company, and the 2d Marine Logistics Group MP Company, as required.

3. Designate area(s) to be isolated and gates to be closed.

4. Search vehicles exiting the Base.

5. Establish a liaison with appropriate area commanders, as required.

6. Notify and request assistance from civil law enforcement agencies, as deemed warranted.

(f) Commanding Officer of Escapee(s) will:

1. Comply with the provisions of reference (c).

2. Provide the Provost Marshal's Office (PMO) with any known information concerning the escape or escapee,

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which would indicate extraordinary measures are warranted to affect the apprehension of the escapee.

(g) Base Command Duty Officer will:

1. Notify the Base Executive Officer.

2. Notify the Command Duty Officer, II Marine Expeditionary Force (II MEF), U.S. Marine Corps Bases, Atlantic (COMMARCORBASESLANT) that the Base PMO has instituted extraordinary operations (i.e., gate closings, inspection of outbound vehicles, etc.) in response to the apprehension of an escaped prisoner.

3. Notify the Consolidated Public Affairs Office (CPAO) that actions are being implemented to affect the apprehension of an escaped prisoner.

5. Administration and Logistics

a. This Order has been coordinated with and concurred in by the Commanding Generals, II Marine Expeditionary Force; Marine Corps Installations East; 2d Marine Division; 2d Marine Logistics Group, Marine Special Operations Command and Commanding Officers, Marine Corps Air Station, New River and U.S. Naval Hospital.

b. Commanders will comply with this Order.

6. Command and Signal

a. Signal. This Order is effective the date signed.

b. Command. This Order is applicable to all units (reserve and active) incarcerating prisoners/detainees at the Camp Lejeune Base Brig.
