Message from the Commanding General Marine Corps Installations East

Marine Corps Installations East (MCIEAST) is a regional command that supports the operational forces and tenant commands. The regional command is comprised of seven installations vital to the training, readiness, and deployment of ground and aviation forces worldwide. These seven installations support all branches of the military, their family members, retirees, and civilian employees who have a tremendous day-to-day impact on the economic health of our states and local communities. In 2011, collectively, the installations of MCIEAST provided over \$9.3 billion to the states of Florida, Georgia, North Carolina, South Carolina, and Virginia.

The majority of these contributions which totaled more than \$5.6 billion were paid in the form of wages and salaries to our military, civilian employees, and retirees. Additionally, businesses, vendors, and contractors benefited directly from \$3.2 billion in construction contracts, and the purchase of materials, supplies, and services from local sources within each state. Further, healthcare provided by the local communities for our military personnel, their families, and retirees has an overall economic value of \$294 million. Lastly, we are very proud of the fact we donated funds to the local communities through aid organizations such as the Combined Federal Campaign.

While MCIEAST installations maintain their primary purpose of supporting the warfighter, we remain committed to our partnerships, involvement in community service, civic development, and economic growth. Sustaining this mission is possible only through the extraordinary level of reciprocal support from our states and surrounding communities. We value our shared accomplishments and look forward to our continued partnerships and collaborative efforts in meeting future economic goals.
