Subj: CONTINUOUS PERFORMANCE IMPROVEMENT (CPI) PROGRAM

(a) MCO 5220.13

(b) USMC MCICOM CPI Guidebook of 2017

- 1. <u>Purpose</u>. To establish policy and procedures for the implementation of CPI and deployment of Lean Six Sigma (LSS) for Marine Corps Installations East-Marine Corps Base Camp Lejeune (MCIEAST-MCB CAMLEJ).
- 2. Cancellations. CG Policy Letter 21-19.
- 3. <u>Information</u>. The references establish policy and assign roles, responsibilities, and tasks to institutionalize a culture of performance improvement and innovation. The overarching goal is to increase organizational capability in support of warfighting mission readiness.
- a. Lean is a systematic approach that focuses on workflow, customer value, and minimizing non-value added activities (e.g., waste) that incur added cost or time to our processes without creating value.
- b. Six Sigma is a disciplined, data-driven methodology that increases efficiency by focusing on customer requirements and measurement controls to reduce and/or eliminate rework/defects (e.g., reducing variation and improving quality).
- c. Theory of Constraints is a systematic approach to understand and analyze an organization's performance by identifying process constraints and bottlenecks in workflow that are preventing that organization from achieving goals and objectives.
- 4. $\underline{\text{Action}}$. Just as we need the Marine Corps Planning Process to accomplish assigned missions and tasks, we need a standard methodology for performance improvement to move from today's reality toward tomorrow's vision and goals.
- a. <u>Installation Commanders</u>. To facilitate the regional implementation of CPI and to maintain cognizance of regional CPI efforts shall:

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- (1) Provide the name of the Installation Champion and contact information to the Assistant Chief of Staff (AC/S), G-7, Business Performance Office (BPO) who will coordinate regional CPI efforts.
 - (2) Establish and implement a CPI Program.
- (3) Not later than two weeks prior to initiation of a proposed CPI project, submit notification of the project to the MCIEAST-MCB CAMLEJ, G-7, Regional Director, BPO. This action will enhance visibility across the region and assist in preventing unnecessary duplication of effort.
- (4) Share installation projects deemed best practices to the MCIEAST-MCB CAMLEJ G-7, Director, BPO when necessary/appropriate.
- (5) Ensure all CPI event information and project status is current in the CPI Management System.
- b. <u>G-7, Director BPO shall</u>: Facilitate the exchange of CPI information regarding policy, projects and training between the subordinate installations and higher headquarters.
