

# MARINE CORPS INSTALLATIONS EAST POLICY STATEMENT ON ENERGY SECURITY



Our highest priority at Marine Corps Installations East (MCIEAST) is to maintain combat-ready units for expeditionary deployment. Doing so takes a significant amount of resources including energy to make it happen. Our bases must ensure a secure energy supply and delivery system as a critical enabler of this mission.

We are committed to ensuring the bases improve upon their energy security posture to the maximum extent possible without impacting readiness. MCIEAST commands, tenant



organizations, and personnel will assist by:

- Working to reduce our energy intensity. Our goal is to reduce energy use 2.5% per year, for a 25% reduction by 2025. We will adopt a shared vision of efficient use of energy resources and practice energy conservation behaviors and implement energy savings projects.
- Supporting your Unit Energy Manager and the Installation Energy Manager in their initiatives to improve awareness and energy savings by MCIEAST personnel. Improving energy focus in the workplace will foster similar behavior on the battlefield and at home.

Adopting and practicing the three pillars of the Energy Security Framework: reliability, resilience, and efficiency will provide a framework for assessing and implementing our energy strategy.

- Reliability measures availability, quality, and security of energy supply and delivery systems.
- Resilience is the ability to prepare for and recover from energy disturbances such as weather, fire, cyber-attacks, and terrorism.
- Efficiency is the use of only the energy required to support mission.

Marines are reliable, resilient, and efficient warfighters, ready to respond to threats in accomplishing the mission. Our energy resources require the same reliability, resilience and efficiency to ensure continuity of operations. We are actively securing energy on our bases and on the battlefield because energy is critical to our mission. Do your part – help MCIEAST improve our energy security.
