Subj: AIR QUALITY MANAGEMENT

(b) MCIEAST-MCB CAMLEJ Title V Air Quality Permit, 06591T43

1. <u>Situation</u>. This Order implements the specifications set forth in reference (a) and provides policy and procedures regarding the construction, operation, maintenance, and compliance requirements of stationary sources of air pollution on Marine Corps Base Camp Lejeune (MCB CAMLEJ) and Marine Corps Air Station New River (MCAS NR). The North Carolina Department of Environmental Quality, with the issuance of reference (b), determined that MCAS NR is contiguous and adjacent property under common ownership and, therefore, one single source of air pollution under the command of Marine Corps Installations East-Marine Corps Base Camp Lejeune (MCIEAST-MCB CAMLEJ). The State also determined that the stationary sources of air pollution on MCB CAMLEJ and MCAS NR exceeded major stationary source emission thresholds, and MCIEAST-MCB CAMLEJ was required to obtain a Title V permit to comply with air quality and emissions requirements. MCB CAMLEJ and MCAS NR may be referred to as the "Installation" within this Order.

2. Cancellation. MCIEAST-MCB CAMLEJO 5090.6B.

3. <u>Mission</u>. To protect human health and the environment; protect, sustain, and enhance mission readiness; and promote compliance with all applicable Federal, state, and local requirements and policy concerning air quality and permitted emission standards on the Installation, establish procedures and assign responsibilities supporting air quality and emissions requirements compliance on the Installation.

4. Execution

## a. Commander's Intent and Concept of Operations

(1) <u>Commander's Intent</u>. To effectively manage, monitor, comply with, and maintain the Installations Title V Operating Air Permit and to ensure compliance with all applicable air quality and emissions requirements.

(2) <u>Concept of Operations</u>. Primary tasks and information for implementation are provided below and in the references, as amended or superseded.

b. Tasks

(1) <u>MCIEAST-MCB CAMLEJ Assistant Chief of Staff (AC/S), G-F</u>. The AC/S G-F shall:

(a) Serve as the principal staff lead for air quality and emissions requirements compliance on the Installation and oversee, coordinate, and direct implementation of this Order and references (a) and (b).

(b) Oversee all construction, maintenance, and repair contracts supporting the Installation, and coordinate the proper permitting and management of stationary air emission sources on the Installation as required by reference (b).

(c) Oversee, coordinate, and direct Installation staff to provide the Environmental Management Division (EMD) air quality and emissions records upon request and as required by reference (b).

(2) <u>MCIEAST-MCB CAMLEJ AC/S G-4</u>. The MCIEAST-MCB CAMLEJ AC/S G-4 shall:

(a) Oversee the Ground Fuels Program to coordinate compliance with all applicable bulk fuel storage tank regulatory requirements found in reference (b).

(b) Direct G-4 staff to provide EMD air quality and emissions records upon request and as required by reference (b).

(3) <u>MCIEAST-MCB CAMLEJ AC/S G-3/5</u>. The MCIEAST-MCB CAMLEJ AC/S G-3/5 shall direct G-3/5 staff to provide EMD air quality and emissions records upon request and as required by reference (b).

(4) <u>MCIEAST-MCB CAMLEJ Director, Marine Corps Community Services</u> (MCCS). The MCCS Director shall:

(a) Coordinate MCCS business operations with EMD to ensure compliance with reference(b) requirements for welding, Ozone Depleting Substances, wood working, and Stage 1 vapor recovery.

(b) Ensure compliance with all other regulatory requirements for MCCS emissions sources.

(c) Direct MCCS staff to provide EMD air quality and emissions records upon request and as required by reference (b).

(5) <u>Commanding Officers of Marine Corps Units and Installation</u> <u>Tenants.</u> The Commanding Officers of Marine Corps units (battalion/squadron and above) and tenants on the Installation shall:

(a) Support MCIEAST-MCB CAMLEJ Air Quality Program requirements.

(b) Maintain air emissions sources and any associated pollution control and monitoring equipment to meet all applicable regulatory requirements, and inform EMD of any maintenance and repair or new construction projects necessary to correct deficiencies.

(c) Notify EMD to request to operate or alter an emission unit in any manner not described in the permit. EMD will review the request and any EMD approval must be received before operating or altering an emission unit in any manner not described in the permit. Immediately notify EMD of any permit violations.

(d) Oversee corrective actions as necessary to avoid subsequent air quality violations.

(e) Oversee Environmental Compliance Coordinators and air emission sources supervisors to ensure that they are knowledgeable of air quality regulations and continuously monitor industrial operations having or likely to require air quality permits.

(f) Direct that semiannual report data is turned into EMD by required due dates.

(g) Before deployment, direct that the Air Quality Title V Compliance Binder and all required records remain with the unit rear party or are temporarily transferred to EMD.

5. Administration and Logistics. Not Applicable.

6. <u>Command and Signal</u>

a. <u>Command</u>. This Order is applicable to MCIEAST-MCB CAMLEJ and MCAS New River command and staff. It is also applicable to Installation tenant commands, activities, and contractors.
