Subj: CALENDAR YEAR 2022 MARINE CORPS MARKSMANSHIP COMPETITION EAST

1. Purpose. This Bulletin announces the annual Marine Corps Marksmanship Competition (MCMC) East for Calendar Year (CY) 2022.

2. Background. The Marine Corps Competition in Arms Program (CIAP) aims to increase the marksmanship proficiency of the units that participate and stimulate interest in marksmanship.

3. Action

a. Commander's Intent and Concept of Operations

(1) Commander's Intent. To promote greater rifle and pistol marksmanship proficiency, increased interaction, camaraderie and reaffirmation of our legacy of "Every Marine a Rifleman".

(2) Concept of Operations

(a) Weapons Training Battalion will host the MCMC-East at the Stone Bay Range Complex from 14-25 March 2022. The shooting competition will be planned, coordinated and conducted by the Marine Corps Shooting Team with Weapons Training Battalion (WTBn) in a supporting role. WTBn will host (2) team captain meetings to confirm the number of competitors and coordinate all necessary support prior to the competition.

(b) The competition will consist of 10 training days over a two week period. Week one will consist of history of the CIAP, classroom instruction, firing positions, dry fire, zero establishment, instruction on advanced pistol and rifle positions, dynamic target engagement and individual marksmanship practice. Week two will consist of individual competition with rifle and pistol, team competition, Annual rifle and pistol qualification, and awards ceremony.

(c) All commands located east of the Mississippi River are invited to participate in the competition. This includes units from II Marine Expeditionary Force (MEF), 2d Marine Division, 2d Marine Logistics Group, 2d Marine Aircraft Wing, U.S. Marine Forces, Special Operations Command, Training and Education Command Schools, Marine Corps Air Station (MCAS) New River, MCAS Cherry Point, MCAS Beaufort, Marine Corps Logistics Base Albany, Marine Corps Support Facility Blount Island, and Marine Corps Recruit Depot Parris Island.

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b. Tasks

(1) MCIEAST Installations and Tenant Commands. Ensure Team Captains attend the meetings in Building RR-11H at 1500 on 28 February 2022 and 1500 on 7 March 2022.

(2) Competitors. Team Captains are required to attend the Team Captain meetings which will take place in Building RR-11H at 1500 on 28 February 2022 and 1500 on 7 March 2022 to discuss the registration process, check in, weapons storage and details of the competition. Those Captains not in the local area may coordinate to participate by telephone.

(3) Commanding Officer, WTBn

(a) Provide billeting to all competitors as needed.

(b) Coordinate messing requirements with the MCIEAST-MCB CAMLEJ G-4, Food Service Officer.

(c) Provide ranges, ammunition, targets, range staff, administrative support, and any additional support as necessary to conduct the competition.

(d) Reserve the Reserve Support Unit (RR-120) Gymnasium for Friday 11 March 2022 to support competitor check-in as well as the Welcome Aboard briefing. Reserve the Gymnasium 14-24 March to support Marine Corps Shooting Team led classes. Reserve the Gymnasium 25 March as the location of the awards ceremony should there be inclement weather.

(4) Assistant Chief Of Staff (AC/S) G-4

(a) Temp Loan 350 chairs and 20 tables to designated WTBn Responsible Officer for use during the MCMC East Competition from 8 March to 28 March 2022.

(b) Provide messing to all competitors as coordinated with CO WTBn.

(5) Communication, Strategy and Operations Officer

(a) Provide support to develop MCMC East Welcome Aboard pamphlet.

(b) Provide photographic and video support in coordination with WTBn.

(c) Develop graphic to promote MCMC East via social media.

c. Coordinating Instructions

(1) The CY 2022 MCMC East will be conducted at WTBn from 14 March to 25 March 2022.

(2) On 28 February 2022, a meeting for all Team Captains from respective units will be conducted in Building RR-11H at 1500. This meeting will cover administrative requirements, check-in procedures, billeting, course of fire, and messing.

(3) On 7 March 2022, Team Captains will have a second meeting in Building RR-11H at 1500. Representatives from WTBn S-3, and S-4 will be present to collect rosters, meal, and billeting requests. Team Captains will turn in all rosters, meal requests and confirm billeting requirements.

(4) On 11 March 2021, the in-brief for all Competitors, Coaches, and Team Captains will go at 0730 in RR-120. All personnel must attend this brief in order to participate in the competition. Units will check in to WTBn for the competition. All paperwork will be turned in and all weapons will be turned into WTBn Armory RR-44. All competitors must be present for the check in and weapons turn in.

(5) Units located outside the local geographic area that wish to participate in Team Captains meetings via telephone will contact the listed POCs in Paragraph 4 (Administration and Logistics) NLT Thursday 27 February 2022 for dial in instructions.

(6) All MCIEAST units are eligible to enter into this competition. Commanding officers (COs) and officers-in-charge of units eligible to participate are requested to enter competitors, per the following criteria:

(a) All units are encouraged to send as many individuals to the competition as possible. The WTBn S-3 will limit the number of competitors per unit if the total match number exceeds 250.

(b) Personnel on Temporary Additional Duty or assigned by the Fleet Assistance Program are authorized to compete with units to which they are attached.

(7) Teams will be organized as follows for the team competition of the MCMC East course of fire:

(a) Each team should have a minimum of four shooting members and may include a non-firing fifth member to serve as the coach.

(b) Teams must include a Marine officer, an enlisted Marine of rank E-5 or below, a member that has never competed in a MCMC, commonly known as a "Tyro", and the fourth firing member may be a Marine of any rank. Per Reference (b) no more than two of the firing members may be distinguished with the type of weapon concerned.

(c) A minimum of two target pullers per team must be present for Team Competition Day.

(d) Units may field multiple teams, not all individual competitors from a unit are required to fire on the team match day.

(e) Commands may compete for large unit or small unit trophies at the MCMC East Competition. A large unit is comprised of 600 or more Marines as found on the unit's Table of Organization and Equipment (TO&E) report from the Total Force Structure Management System (TFSMS). A Small unit is comprised of less than 600 Marines as found on the unit's TO&E report. If fewer than two eligible teams are present, the small unit trophy will not be awarded.

(8) The M16A4/M4/M27 Service Rifle with authorized optic with authorized sling (MARADMIN 184/17) M9 and M18 Modular Handgun System (MHS) are authorized for the competition per MARADMIN 091/21.

(9) All shooters are required to register on practiscore at <https://practiscore.com/>

(10) Competitors that fall within the top 10 percent of competing Marines will be given an invite to Marine Corps Championships to take place 4-15 April 2022 at MCB Quantico, VA.

b. Logistics

(1) Messing will be available at the Stone Bay Mess Hall (RR-135).

(2) Team Captains will turn in all rosters, meal requests and billeting requirements to the WTBn S-3 and S-4 respectively (910) 440-2917/2630 in Building RR-11H no later than 7 March 2022 at 1500.

(3) All necessary shooting equipment will be specified in the welcome aboard package published by WTBn at a later date and briefed to the Team Captains at the meeting on 7 March 2022. All necessary shooting equipment will be the responsibility of the individual competitor and/or his parent unit.

(4) The M16A4/M4/M27 Service Rifle (with Rifle Combat Optic) with Blue Force Gear, Vickers Combat Application Sling (VCAS), M9 Service Pistol or M18 MHS are authorized for the competition. Shooting/coaching chairs with spotting scopes and pistol boxes are authorized.

(5) Limited Technical Inspections for all weapons must be completed and documentation submitted when weapons are turned into the WTBn Armory on 11 March 2022.

5. Command and Signal. This Bulletin is applicable to all active and reserve, units located East of the Mississippi River.
