DoD Instruction 1400.25 and the DoD Priority Placement Program Handbook of November 2019, minimizes the adverse effects on employees caused by actions such as, but not limited to, reductions-in-force, base closures, realignments, consolidations, contracting out, position classification decisions, rotation from overseas, and transfers of function.



The Priority Placement Program is the primary vehicle for implementing this policy

throughout the Department of Defense (DoD). This program is a strong, unified, defense-wide effort that impacts on recruitment and placement by matching vacancies against the registration of surplus employees.
